Matters Arising Update for Wonersh Parish Council Meeting on Thursday 12th June 2008

- 07/168 Bus Shelter Shamley Green
Quotations for the work required have been sought and will be circulated once received.
- 08/10e Community Speed Watch
The signs have been received and passed to Cllr Shareef. The ones commissioned from HM Coldingley were incorrect and are being rectified
- 08/14d Global Warming
Cllr Powell-Evans has agreed to produce a paper for the June meeting.
- 08/20 Footpath below Chinthurst Hill
Enforcement officer has been contacted but has not yet reported back
- 08/31c: Car parking in Shamley Green
Clerk has asked Surrey Hills Office about posts by the shop.
- 08/45 Village Gateways –
Clerk has written to Highways notifying them of the Parish Council's intention to replace the gateways with ones similar to Blackheath.
Cllr Powell-Evans has forwarded e-mails and letter from Clerk to D Munro. So far, no response. Also the article did not go in May edition of parish mag so hoping it is in this month's and awaiting any response from residents.
- 08/48 Community Police Meeting:
Cllr Shareef has agreed to investigate whether SCC/WBC intend to provide lighting in the alley between Garden Close and Sweetwater Lane.
The Clerk has investigated the cost of solar lighting, and will table the results at the June meeting.
- 08/56 The Commons Enhancement and Management Plan: The Clerk has met with Sarah Henderson and has been given a final draft of the Shamley Green and Lordshill Management plan, which has been circulated to councillors for final comments, to go back to SH as soon as possible, before the document is printed. The Clerk understands that this will be shortly, as design has now been agreed and appropriate pictures taken.
- 08/63d Wonersh Stoolball Club: The Clerk has written requesting details on design. It was suggested referring to the Norbury Park website
- 08/63g: Lords Hill Cycle Track: The Clerk has reported this.
- 08/63i Cricket Field The Clerk met with Martin Maybury. The pipe which runs across the Green has collapsed, and the resulting water seepage has caused the ground to sink. Martin plans to mend the pipe with either a smaller pipe, and then pack around it, or a piece of plastic which can be bent to shape. He will then reinstate the ground. He estimates that this will cost in the region of £150, and he will put in a claim to the parish council when the work is finished.
- 08/72 Community Fund: The £500 received from Cllr Povey will be transferred to Highways once their invoice is received.

- 08/79 Footpath parallel to B2128 not currently accessible. Clerk has reported to Highways.
- 08/81 BT phone box de-commissioning: The Council's response has been sent to WBC and BT.
- 08/82 Lease at Lordshill Playground: Comments have been returned to WBC Legal Department.
- 08/84 Wonersh Surgery: Clerk has asked for contact details, as advised in the letter from the practice manager, to be publicised in the surgery, and for a handout to be made available. She has also suggested that these details be added to the web site.
