Matters Arising Update for Wonersh Parish Council Meeting on Thursday 13th September 2007

135. Wonersh to Shamley Green footpath – this is being tackled under the Shamley Green Parish Action Plan
- 06/85 Lease at Lordshill Playground – The lease as amended by the Parish Council has been sent back to WBC for consideration
- 06/106 Rospa Playground Recommendations - the playgrounds have been inspected and all recommendations for improvements or repairs were categorised “low risk..” Agenda Item 11
- 07/011 Lowering of speed limit in The Street, Wonersh – this matter needs further discussion following the report from the recently formed Traffic Committee of Wonersh residents. The Clerk understands that they will be reporting soon.
- 07/016 Correspondence – Hedge at Lordshill playground -the Clerk understands that this piece of work has been completed. NFA
- 07/030 Fly tipping in Norley Lane, Shamley Green – this item has been referred to the Waverley Borough Council Clean Up project. Nothing heard yet from WBC regarding this matter.
- 07/050 Signage at Gerald’s Wood - still awaiting repainting but in abeyance until the future of the mountain bike track and the use of Gerald’s Wood is decided.
- 07/068 Bus shelters – Clerk has e-mailed Mr Cannon, WBC engineer, again asking for estimates.
- 07/109 Conservation Areas – Clerk has received a reply from Geraldine Moloney, WBC Planning Dept, saying that she will discuss the matter of reviewing Wonersh parish with senior colleagues
- 07/111 Common land at Shamley Green - the Tudor oak and willow tree have been pruned by the tree surgeon..

(b) Shamley Green Pond – Cllr Shareef has informed the Clerk that he has been unable to contact the contractor who was given an estimate for pipe work at the pond.
The Clerk has informed Cllr Band of the activities in which Sarah Henderson is involved of which the Clerk is aware.
- 07/126 Grants
As agreed, grants of £250 sent to Hoppa Bus service and £100 to Waverley Youth Theatre
- 07/128 Village Gateways –
Clerk has written to Highways asking why the village gateway at Womersley has not been re-instated.
- 07/129 Councillor with Portfolio for Youth - Cllr Goodchild will report at the October PC meeting
- 07/130 Blackheath Village Hall's application to SITA – the Clerk has written a letter of support. NFA
- 07/131 Reports from working parties
(a) Gerald's Wood – the Clerk has spoken to the insurers on three occasions and received three conflicting views. The Clerk has now received written information from Allianz Cornhill on BMX and cycle tracks and has been advised by them to have the area assessed by a recognised inspector. The Clerk has spoken to the inspector who has carried out a report on the playgrounds. She will be free to assess the mountain bike track in about 4 weeks.
The Clerk has erected a sign at the entrance to Gerald's Wood closing it temporarily. This sign has had to be replaced at least 4 times.
Cllr Healy has gathered information from the Hurtwood Committee on their handling of mountain bikes.
The Risk Assessment and Audit committee is meeting on 12.09.07 when all these matters will be discussed. Agenda Item 11.

the Council were advised that bids have to be made to the Local Committee in Sept but, as there has not been a PC meeting where this could be discussed between the meeting and the deadline for bids, it was discussed between the Chairman, Vice- Chairman and Cllr Morris. A decision was made that a bid of some sort should be made in order

to maintain the parish profile. In the time, it was not possible to gather information to make a well thought out bid for lowering the speed limit in The Street and changing the junction at The Pepperpot as discussed in council meetings. However, over the years, the extension of the pavement beyond Gerald's Wood has been discussed and requested with SCC. It has been possible to put together a bid for this and the report was circulated to councillors for their comments prior to sending to Dr Povey.
